



Updates since last State Situation Report

SITUATION REPORT # 2
1700 Hours December 13, 2012

Governor Bob McDonnell declared a State of Emergency at 0950 hours on 26 October due to the anticipation of severe weather impacting the Commonwealth as a result of Hurricane Sandy to include a limited mandatory evacuation for low lying areas along the Virginia coast and Chesapeake Bay. Governor McDonnell's request for an Emergency Declaration was approved by President Obama on 30 October.

Governor Bob McDonnell submitted request for Major Disaster Declaration on November 16, 2012 to FEMA Region III for processing and forwarding to President Obama. Governor McDonnell announced on November 26, 2012 that Virginia's request for a Major Disaster Declaration to help local and state governments recover from the impact of Hurricane Sandy was approved by President Obama. FEMA's Public Assistance Program was approved for the counties of Accomack, Arlington, Clarke, Craig, Culpeper, Essex, Fauquier, Frederick, Greene, Highland, King and Queen, Lancaster, Loudoun, Madison, Mathews, Middlesex, Nelson, Northampton, Northumberland, Prince William, Rappahannock, Shenandoah, Surry, Warren and Westmoreland and the cities of Fairfax, Falls Church and Manassas. FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Grant Program was approved for all counties and cities in Virginia. Assistance for individuals, FEMA Individual Assistance Program, in Accomack was requested and denied by FEMA on Thursday, November 29, 2012.

Virginia Department of Health, Office of the Chief Medical Examiner confirmed 3 storm related fatalities.



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FEMA/State Agreement was signed by Governor Bob McDonnell on November 30, 2012 and the Joint Field Office (JFO), located at 9954 Mayland Drive, Henrico, VA 23233, is operational from 0730 to 1630 Monday through Friday until further notice.

Joint Incident Priorities:

1. Ensure a safe and healthy working environment.
2. Work together as a cohesive team.
3. Provide a timely and effective Public Assistance program.
4. Provide a timely and effective Hazard Mitigation program.

Joint Incident Objectives:

1. Complete Pre-Application/Request for Public Assistance (RPA) processing and determination of eligible applicants.
2. Conduct training for Public Assistance staff, State, and Applicants.
3. Approve DR-4092 Administrative Plan
4. ***Implement Public Assistance Program***
5. Support implementation of environmental and historic regulatory guidance by Commonwealth.
6. Provide financial and administrative support to JFO and deployed staff
7. Disseminate key messages and products for Virginia's recovery.
8. ***Implement Hazard Mitigation Program***

Deputy Commonwealth Coordinating Officer:

- Coordinating joint activities between the Commonwealth and FEMA.

Operations Section:

- ***Request for Small Business Administration (SBA) disaster declaration approved 7 December.***
 - ***SBA Disaster Assistance Center opened 11 December and will remain open through 20 December 2012***
- ***Provided JFO Briefing to Delegate Richard Anderson***
- ***Coordinating with Accomack County regarding non-federal assistance to affected population to include, voluntary organization resources and Virginia Disaster Relief Fund***
 - ***Individual Assistance receiving excellent support for Accomack County CERT program in support of SBA Assistance Center***
- ***Individual Assistance coordinating with Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development, Accomack-Northampton PDC and Accomack County on housing solutions for affected population***
- ***Individual Assistance Program Manager met with Accomack County officials to discuss disaster impacts and assistance.***
- Coordinating with some localities to reassess impacts and associated costs to support request to add-on to Major Disaster Declaration.
- Monitoring and refining JFO staffing pattern and costs

Public Assistance Section:

- ***Thirty three (33) Requests for Public Assistance received from applicants to date.***
 - ***Outreach being conducted in the affected areas to identify and encourage potential applicants to submit their Requests for Public Assistance.***
- Developing Public Assistance Administrative Plan
- ***Conducted Public Assistance training for electric cooperatives on 12 December. Provided guidance with regard to Hurricane Sandy operations as well as potential mitigation initiatives.***

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Hazard Mitigation Section:

- *Developed draft Hazard Mitigation Strategy. Will be coordinating with FEMA Region III with regard to finalizing objectives.*
- Developing Hazard Mitigation Grant Program Administrative Plan.

Communications/IT:

- *CradlePoint cellular, wireless network established for Commonwealth of Virginia staff working at JFO*
 - *Network facilitates Internet access and Virtual Private Network connectivity and includes printers and a file/print server*
