SUMMARY

Gov. Bob McDonnell declared a State of Emergency for Virginia August 26, in preparation for Hurricane Irene. The storm claimed five fatalities statewide and caused damages totaling more than \$39 million. A presidential declaration for Public Assistance that included the counties of Louisa and Gloucester was approved August 26 for Emergency Measures Only under EM-3399. Another 28 localities originally included in this declaration were brought under Public Assistance Declaration, DR-4024, approved September 3 for Categories A-G. Add-ons approved on September 10 and September 28, brought the total number of jurisdictions for this declaration to 48.

Designated under DR-4024 were the counties of Amelia, Accomack, Brunswick, Caroline, Charles City, Chesterfield, Dinwiddie, Essex, Greensville, Hanover, Henrico, Isle of Wight, James City, King and Queen, King George, King William, Lancaster, Louisa, Lunenburg, Mathews, Middlesex, New Kent, Northampton, Northumberland, Nottoway, Powhatan, Prince George, Richmond, Southampton, Surry, Sussex, Westmoreland and York, and the cities of Alexandria, Chesapeake, Colonial Heights, Emporia, Franklin, Hampton, Hopewell, Newport News, Norfolk, Petersburg, Poquoson, Portsmouth, Richmond, Suffolk, Virginia Beach and Williamsburg.

On September 21, FEMA announced an SBA Disaster Declaration authorizing low-interest disaster loans for the following localities: (Primary) New Kent County, City of Petersburg; (Contiguous) Counties of Charles City, Chesterfield, Dinwiddie, Hanover, Henrico, James City, King and Queen, King William and Prince George; and the independent city of Colonial Heights.

More than 82 percent of the anticipated 1,067 Project Worksheets to repair infrastructure hurricane damage have been completed. A total of nearly \$19 million has been obligated for 645 projects. Localities have submitted a total of 947 requests for assistance, accounting for 89 percent of the worksheets. Completion of the application process is expected by the end of January. The Virginia Department of Transportation is completing work on 118 project applications worth an estimated \$18 million.

Meantime, VDEM has asked FEMA to consider an application for storm damages to the Mattaponi Indian Reservation. The tribe had asked for and received assistance for debris removal but missed the deadline for other damages, including erosion and landslides along the river bank which affected the boat landing and shad hatchery.

2. Ensure a safe and healthy working environment.
3. Work together as a cohesive team.
4. Provide a timely and effective Public Assistance program.
5. Provide a timely and effective Hazard Mitigation program.

Joint Incident Objectives:

1. Implement Public Assistance Program for designated counties impacted by Hurricane Irene.
2. Conduct an effective outreach strategy to manage expectations of applicants, local officials and Virginia delegation.
3. Coordinate Mitigation, Historic Preservation and Environmental activities with Public Assistance.

Deputy Commonwealth Coordinating Officer (DCCO) Brett Burdick:

- Coordinate joint activities between the Commonwealth and FEMA.

Operations Section George Roarty:

- Continue to monitor operations and coordinate with FEMA and applicants to ensure the transition of PA operations to the FEMA regional office by the end of January.
- Complete Public Assistance administration plan.
- Continue to monitor Project Worksheet production.
- Coordinating with FEMA with regard to refining staffing pattern.
- Coordinate Public Assistance and Community Relations programs activities with other state agencies and FEMA.

Public Assistance Supervisor Nealia Dabney:

- **FEMA has obligated nearly \$19.0 million in Public Assistance funds to cover the cost of repairs in 645 projects. In all, 947 repair projects out of 1,067 anticipated have been submitted.**
- Received 146 requests for Public Assistance.
- Deploy Public Assistance teams covering 48 local jurisdictions affected by the hurricane.

External Affairs Bob Spieldenner:

- Coordinate outreach to local governments and respond to media and citizens inquiries.

Communications/IT:

- Maintain JFO network and telephone connectivity with VITA/NG.
