SUMMARY

Gov. Bob McDonnell declared a State of Emergency for Virginia August 26, in response to the 5.8 magnitude Louisa County earthquake August 23. Several thousand residents and dozens of businesses and other entities reported damage. Louisa County High School and Thomas Jefferson Elementary School suffered major damage. By mid-December, 50 aftershocks in excess of 2.0 magnitude rumbled through Central Virginia.

FEMA announced a Presidential Major Declaration for Individual Assistance November 4 for Louisa County and added Public Assistance November 10. Later, Spotsylvania County and the city of Fredericksburg were declared for Public Assistance. An expanded outreach program, extensive site visits and inspections turned up large numbers of structures with significant damage that had previously gone undetected or unreported.

On December 28, FEMA approved requests for federal assistance for seven jurisdictions affected by the earthquake:

- Culpeper County: Individual and Public Assistance.
- Fluvanna, Goochland and Orange counties, Individual Assistance.
- Northampton County, Public Assistance.
- Spotsylvania County and the city of Fredericksburg, Individual Assistance.

Individual Assistance

FEMA denied the Commonwealth's request Individual Assistance for Louisa County October 7, but based on additional data, reversed its decision November 4 and approved assistance for individuals and business owners in Louisa County.

FEMA granted a 60-day extension of the teleregistration period until March 5, 2012. VDEM requested the extension because of the steady high volume of teleregistrations and the number of individuals visiting the Disaster Recovery Center in Louisa. The volume of registrations and visits reflected an intensive Community Relations initiative.

In today's IA report, 4,096 individuals from 58 Virginia jurisdictions had called the FEMA teleregistration number to report earthquake damages. Of them, 75 percent have been approved for financial assistance totaling \$7.8 million. Of the 91 new registrants, all but 6 were from Louisa County and the six newly designated jurisdictions.

Eleven recipients are eligible for the maximum Individual and Households Program grant of \$31,400.

Disaster Recovery Center

The Louisa DRC, closed temporarily for the holidays December 17, reopened Thursday. A new DRC to provide services to six newly designated jurisdictions opened in Spotsylvania County. Both DRCs are open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. seven days a week. If possible, individuals should teleregister prior to visiting the DRC. The toll-free number is 1-800-621-3362.

In their first day of operation, 99 individuals visited the two DRCs. During November and December, 2,131 visited the Louisa location.

Community Relations

Community Relations teams began canvassing the new localities declared for Individual Assistance: Culpeper, Fluvanna, Goochland, Orange and Spotsylvania counties and the city of Fredericksburg.

SBA Loans

The Small Business Administration reported that it has approved \$2.2 million in low-interest loans to repair damages from the quake, including \$439,900 to businesses.

Public Assistance

The governor announced November 10 that FEMA had approved a Major Disaster Declaration for Public Assistance for Louisa County requested by the Commonwealth October 21. FEMA designated Spotsylvania County November 18 as an add-on for Public Assistance. On December 6, FEMA added the city of Fredericksburg as eligible for Public Assistance. On December 28, Culpeper and Northampton counties were added.

As the extent of significant amounts of infrastructure and private structural damage became apparent, VDEM and FEMA sent out additional joint assessment teams to quantify it in surrounding jurisdictions. On December 6, FEMA granted an extension of the deadline to December 22 for completing verification of damages for both Individual and Public Assistance requests in undesignated localities.

Two four-member Emergency Management Assistance Compact teams from Arizona and Louisiana are supporting the development of Project Worksheets for Hurricane Irene, the Louisa County earthquake and Tropical Storm Lee. The teams will support the process for 30 days.

2. Support Disaster Recovery Center operations in Louisa and Spotsylvania Counties.
3. Inform potential applicants of need to register through effective outreach effort.
4. Assess survivor unmet needs in Louisa and six add-on localities.
5. Coordinate Mitigation, Historic Preservation and Environmental activities.
6. Integrate volunteer agencies into the IA relief process.

7. Conduct an effective outreach strategy to manage expectations of applicants, local officials and Virginia delegation.
