2015-09-29 Severe Weather
07 October 2015 – 1600 hours
New information in red

Summary:

A cold front combined with the effects of Hurricane Joaquin passing along the east coast caused heavy rain and flooding throughout much of the Commonwealth beginning September 29. Heavy rain, ranging between 1 and 10 inches caused flooding of rivers, streams, and low lying areas. Tidal flooding also occurred along coastal areas for several days.

Contiguous States and FEMA Region III

Governor of South Carolina, Nikki Haley, signed an Executive Order declaring a state of emergency in South Carolina in anticipation of heavy rains, potential flooding, and the possibility that Hurricane Joaquin may affect South Carolina. On Saturday, 3 October, President Barack Obama signed South Carolina Emergency Declaration beginning 1 October, 2015. The President signed a Major Disaster Declaration for South Carolina on Monday, 5 October.

State Actions

Governor McAuliffe declared a state of emergency on September 30, 2015 at 5:04 p.m.

VEST/VDEM/VEOC

ESF # 1 Transportation

- As of 1400 on 7 October: **0** Interstates closed, **0** Primary roads closed, **20** Secondary road closed (**primarily in the Salem and Staunton Districts.**)
- **VDOT advises that the 1400 7 October 2015 Road Conditions Report is the final report for this weather event.**

- 3 reconnaissance flights with Civil Air Patrol completed on 6 October, imagery pending:
 - Coastal areas of Virginia Beach and shoreline
 - Floyd and Patrick Counties

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- Montgomery County and Roanoke River Basin

ESF #14 Recovery and Mitigation
